

THE ACADEMY MODEL

ACADEMY PROGRAMMING INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING:













MONTHLY ACADEMIES

Monthly programming over four years for youth in foster care focused on academics and life skills while they are in high school.

CAREGIVER ENGAGEMENT

Seminars and workshops that provide tools to caregivers to become advocates for their youth.

SUMMER ACADEMY

Intensive 2-4 week residential enrichment program on a university campus.

VIRTUAL ENGAGEMENT

Weekly mentoring and tutoring sessions, as well as an open environment to connect and build community through virtual hangouts.



STEAM ACADEMY

Virtual Tech Talks and access to labs that focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math.



SCHOLAR ADVISORY COMMITTEE (SAC)

Leadership opportunity for scholars focused on becoming civically engaged and enacting change in their local communities.



ALUMNI PROGRAM

Offered to scholars who graduate the Academy as a resource during their transition to adulthood.

FIRST STAR ALUMNI PROGRAM

The First Star Alumni Program's goal is to remain connected and ensure Alumni have access to resources and the First Star network as they transition into adulthood, career, and advanced education.



81% of the 2024 graduating class enrolled in the Alumni Program

79% of enrolled Alumni engage with the program via resources, newsletters and events

18% of peer mentors are First Star Alumni

FIRST STAR STUDENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE (SAC)

First Star encourages advocacy and engagement in social justice through the Scholar Advisory Committee (SAC). SAC is composed of current scholars from across the First Star Academy network and from the Alumni Program. SAC allows scholars to build community, freely share their ideas and opinions, and dialogue about important issues!



80% of SAC scholars were returners from last year

100% of SAC scholars stated they felt more confident taking on leadership roles.



National Graduating Class





Workforce Pathways



LIFE SKILLS AND SELF DISCOVERY

The Program's Life Skills Programming highlight offered students essential practical skills for daily living through interactive and engaging sessions. Scholars learned valuable lessons in credit building, time management, and effective communication, which are critical for their personal and professional development. The hands-on activities like and real-world applications provided a strong foundation for independent living and future success.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

The program's Health and Well-Being highlight emphasized the importance of physical and mental wellness through a series of engaging activities and informative sessions. Scholars enjoyed fitness workshops like yoga and skateboarding, mindfulness practices, and round-robin basketball and volleyball, all designed to promote holistic health.





CAREER EXPLORATION

The Career Exploration Programming highlight offered students invaluable insights into various career paths through interactive workshops such as communications and public speaking, ASU Pipeline program presentations, and hands-on activities. Scholars engaged with industry experts, fostering a deeper understanding of potential career opportunities and the skills required for success.

LEADERSHIP AND SELF ADVOCACY

The Program's Leadership and Advocacy Programming highlight empowered students with essential leadership skills and advocacy tools through dynamic workshops and interactive sessions. Participants engaged in activities that fostered critical thinking, effective communication, and strategic planning during 1 on 1 and small group sessions, preparing them to become proactive leaders in their schools and communities. Another highlight emphasized the importance of advocacy, teaching scholars how to effectively voice their concerns and drive positive change. This focus on leadership and advocacy significantly enhanced the scholars' confidence and capability to influence their future and their communities positively.





COLLEGE READINESS

The College Readiness Programming highlight offered the scholars immersive workshops like College 101, speed dating with professionals from various career fields, financial literacy, professional attire, and campus life, scholars gained invaluable insights and practical skills to navigate their academic futures. The program's dynamic college tours of the College of Law and the Cronkite School of Journalism, coupled with personalized guidance from university youth coaches and peer mentors, significantly boosted the scholars' confidence and preparedness for college success.

BRIGHT FUTURES AHEAD

The National Bright Futures Survey was developed in partnership with Dr. Philip Hong from the University of Georgia to better understand our scholars' hopes and aspirations as it relates to their academic and future goals. In creating this survey and collecting feedback from scholars, we are embracing the challenge young people face and how we can be better stewards of their emotions and feelings as we support their growth in our Academies!


