

First Star at Illinois State University serves college-bound foster youth in Central Illinois and includes monthly Saturday classes, year-round academic mentoring, life skills classes, and caregiver engagement. Program participants also reside on the campus at ISU for two weeks during the summer as part of a campus immersion program.



The Academy Model

ACADEMY PROGRAMMING INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING:













MONTHLY ACADEMIES

Monthly programming over four years for youth in foster care focused on academics and life skills while they are in high school.

CAREGIVER ENGAGEMENT

Seminars and workshops that provide tools to caregivers to become advocates for their youth.

SUMMER ACADEMY

Intensive 2-4 week residential enrichment program on a university campus.

VIRTUAL ENGAGEMENT

Weekly mentoring and tutoring sessions, as well as an open environment to connect and build community through virtual hangouts.



STEAM ACADEMY

Virtual Tech Talks and access to labs that focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math.



SCHOLAR ADVISORY COMMITTEE (SAC)

Leadership opportunity for scholars focused on becoming civically engaged and enacting change in their local communities.



ALUMNI PROGRAM

Offered to scholars who graduate the Academy as a resource during their transition to adulthood.

FIRST STAR ALUMNI PROGRAM

The First Star Alumni Program's goal is to remain connected and ensure Alumni have access to resources and the First Star network as they transition into adulthood, career, and advanced education.



81% of the 2024 graduating class enrolled in the Alumni Program

79% of enrolled Alumni engage with the program via resources, newsletters and events

18% of peer mentors are First Star Alumni

FIRST STAR STUDENT ADVISORY **COMMITTEE (SAC)**

First Star encourages advocacy and engagement in social justice through the Scholar Advisory Committee (SAC). SAC is composed of current scholars from across the First Star Academy network and from the Alumni Program. SAC allows scholars to build community, freely share their ideas and opinions, and dialogue about important issues!



80% of SAC scholars were returners from last year


100% of SAC scholars stated they felt more confident taking on leadership roles.

National Graduating Class










LIFE SKILLS AND SELF DISCOVERY

• In the "Secure the Bag STRIVE session, scholars worked together to Identify different money management strategies that Included goal setting, saving for an emergency fund, and overall budgeting.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

- Scholars participated In two cooking classes at the Family and Consumer kitchen In Turner Hall.
- Scholars participated In a dance class In which they could move their bodies and stimulate their minds.
- Scholars enjoyed going to the ISU Recreation Center for a strengths class that focused on weight training.





CAREER EXPLORATION

• Scholars participating in a career fair during Saturday Academy. The met with employers and had to ask a list of questions about their company. They were encouraged to learn about new careers and the educational requirements for the job. The afternoon session was focused on career assessments researching their chosen career.

LEADERSHIP AND SELF ADVOCACY

 Reach for the stars was a session focused on building scholars' confidence in the leadership and the power of their voice. They started out by looking at why we call celebrities stars. Scholars talked about entertainers and athletes that influence them and why they admire them. Next, they looked at some videos of youth who are doing impactful work. Finally they discussed Issues they are seeing In their schools and community.





COLLEGE READINESS

Scholars were split up in groups this year for their college tours. Seniors who
are enrolling in ISU this Fall went on a campus tour that included meeting
with key staff who will work with them on housing financial aid and other
resources specific for youth in care. The rest of the group took a tour of the
local community college and learned about career training programs.

BRIGHT FUTURES AHEAD

The National Bright Futures Survey was developed in partnership with Dr. Philip Hong from the University of Georgia to better understand our scholars' hopes and aspirations as it relates to their academic and future goals. In creating this survey and collecting feedback from scholars, we are embracing the challenge young people face and how we can be better stewards of their emotions and feelings as we support their growth in our Academies!


