THE ACADEMY MODEL

ACADEMY PROGRAMMING INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING:



MONTHLY ACADEMIES

Monthly programming over four years for youth in foster care focused on academics and life skills while they are in high school.

SUMMER ACADEMY

Intensive 2-4 week residential enrichment program on a university campus.

CAREGIVER ENGAGEMENT

Seminars and workshops that provide tools to caregivers to become advocates for their youth.

VIRTUAL ENGAGEMENT

Weekly mentoring and tutoring sessions, as well as an open environment to connect and build community through virtual hangouts.



STEAM ACADEMY

Virtual Tech Talks and access to labs that focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math.

Leadership opportunity for scholars focused on becoming civically engaged and enacting change in their local communities.

FIRST STAR ALUMNI PROGRAM

The First Star Alumni Program's goal is to remain connected and ensure Alumni have access to resources and the First Star network as they transition into adulthood, career, and advanced education.

79% of enrolled Alumni engage with the program via resources, newsletters and events

22% of peer mentors are First Star Alumni

FIRST STAR STUDENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE (SAC)

First Star encourages advocacy and engagement in social justice through the Scholar Advisory Committee (SAC). SAC is composed of current scholars from across the First Star Academy network and from the Alumni Program. SAC allows scholars to build community, freely share their ideas and opinions, and dialogue about important issues!



80% of SAC scholars were returners from last year

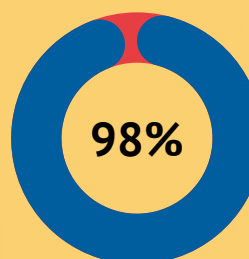

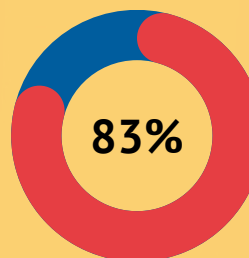

National Graduating Class



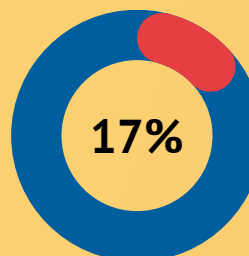

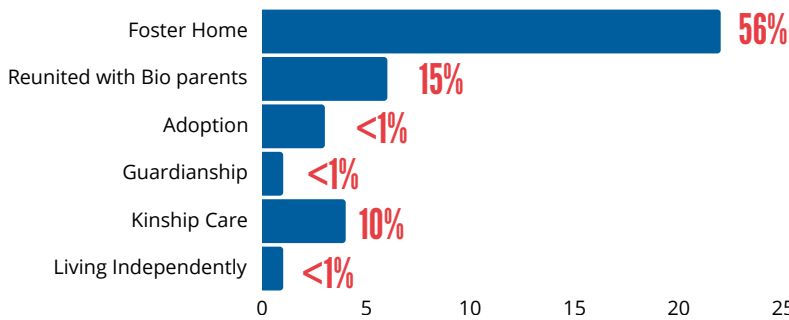

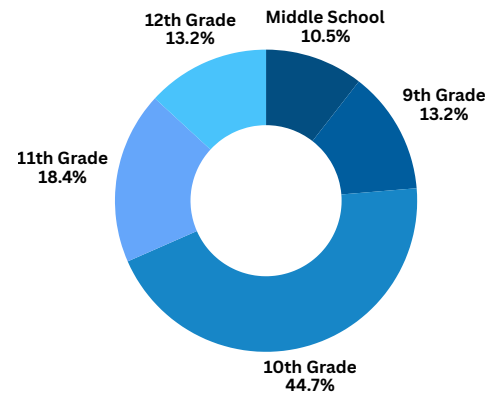
RACE AND ETHNICITY

LIFE SKILLS AND SELF DISCOVERY

Our math teacher guided students in developing financial literacy by working with real-world numbers, including researching apartment costs, paying utilities, and budgeting for groceries. This hands-on project helped students understand the true cost of living and the importance of financial planning. Twice a week, students also participated in OG Therapy workshops to strengthen social skills, including making friends, communicating effectively, and expressing themselves. These sessions, continued from previous years, remain highly engaging and impactful for youth.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Each afternoon, students participated in a variety of physical activities, including swimming, soccer, basketball, volleyball, and pickleball, with two options available each day. Volleyball on the outdoor sand courts proved to be the favorite activity.



CAREER EXPLORATION

All participating First Star scholars engaged with the University of Utah Career Services Center to explore potential careers, pathways, and complete aptitude evaluations. Additionally, seniors worked with our community partners at the 1999 Collective to learn about trade schools and workforce-focused opportunities for youth transitioning out of care. Students gained practical skills by developing resumes and cover letters while learning directly from former foster youth about diverse career paths.

LEADERSHIP AND SELF ADVOCACY

Scholars participated in a diplomacy simulation workshop, gaining firsthand experience in responding to a public health emergency. The activity helped students understand the roles of various organizations involved in public health response and provided an opportunity to practice advocating for their ideas.



COLLEGE READINESS

While living on the University of Utah campus, students explored university resources and participated in workshops designed to introduce them to college life. They toured campus, engaged with campus organizations, and experienced aspects of "college life" firsthand, including using dining halls, the student union, the library, and campus transportation. Additionally, seniors participated in weekly courses offered by our community partner, the 1999 Collective, focusing on selecting majors, choosing colleges, and planning for life after care.

BRIGHT FUTURES AHEAD

The National Bright Futures Survey was developed in partnership with Dr. Philip Hong from the University of Georgia to better understand our scholars' hopes and aspirations as it relates to their academic and future goals. In creating this survey and collecting feedback from scholars, we are embracing the challenge young people face and how we can be better stewards of their emotions and feelings as we support their growth in our Academies!

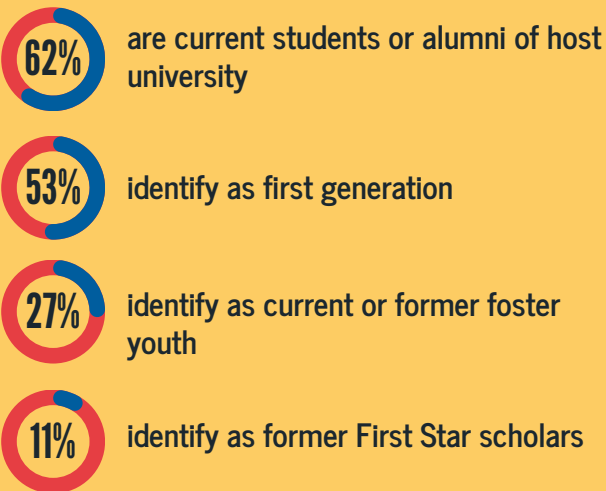

Through the "Modeling Permanency Project," a fellowship with Kent State University and the Dave Thomas Foundation, the University of Utah Academy and other First Star Academies receive hands-on coaching, mentoring, and training to strengthen permanency and caregiver support programs. This initiative equips academies to better serve youth impacted by foster care and their caregivers, building on the successful model implemented at the First Star Kent State Academy.

CREATION CONFERENCE



First Star Hosted the first-ever nationally broadcast creation conference. This Conference was a student-centered opportunity for students to engage with speakers and feel connected to the entire First Star network. During the conference, scholars experienced:

- A nationally recognized keynote speaker sharing insights on resilience and leadership
- An interactive storytelling workshop led by the showrunner and cast of Marvel's Runaways
- Education sessions, team games, and networking opportunities
- Access to valuable resources and ongoing support from First Star's national network

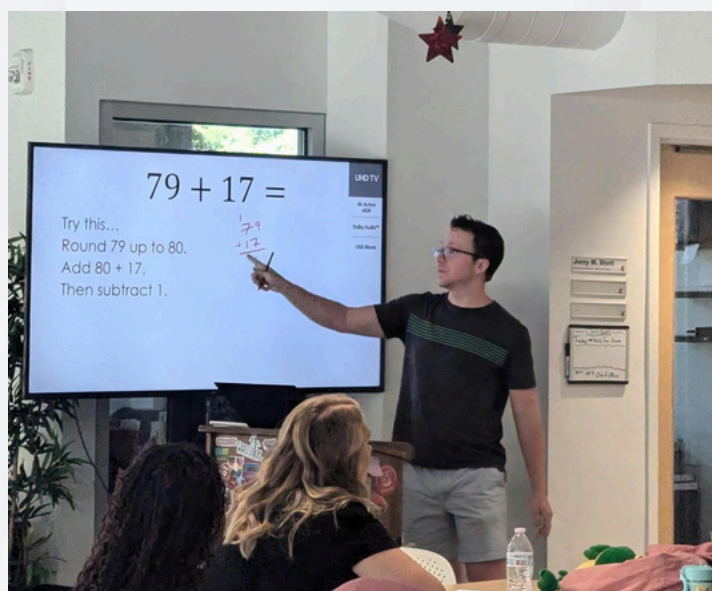
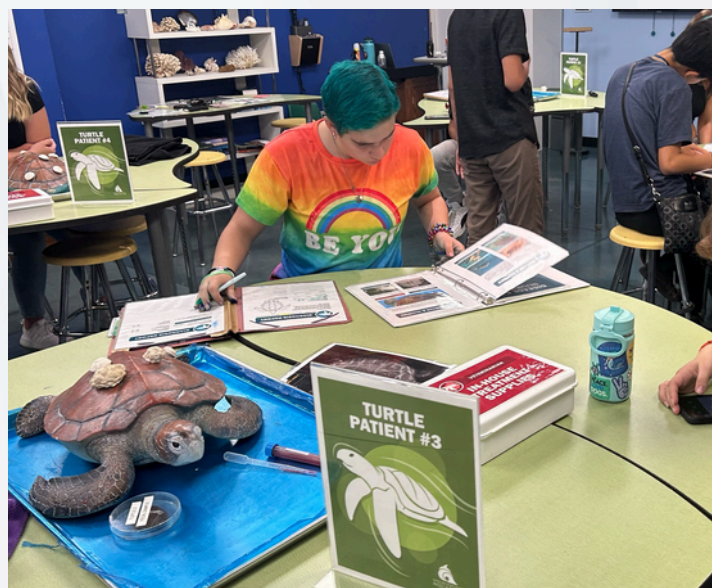
