# THE ACADEMY MODEL

## ACADEMY PROGRAMMING INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING:



### MONTHLY ACADEMIES

Monthly programming over four years for youth in foster care focused on academics and life skills while they are in high school.

### CAREGIVER ENGAGEMENT


Seminars and workshops that provide tools to caregivers to become advocates for their youth.

### SUMMER ACADEMY

Intensive 2-4 week residential enrichment program on a university campus.

### VIRTUAL ENGAGEMENT

Weekly mentoring and tutoring sessions, as well as an open environment to connect and build community through virtual hangouts.



### STEAM ACADEMY

Virtual Tech Talks and access to labs that focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math.



### SCHOLAR ADVISORY COMMITTEE (SAC)

Leadership opportunity for scholars focused on becoming civically engaged and enacting change in their local communities.



### ALUMNI PROGRAM

Offered to scholars who graduate the Academy as a resource during their transition to adulthood.

### FIRST STAR ALUMNI PROGRAM

The First Star Alumni Program's goal is to remain connected and ensure Alumni have access to resources and the First Star network as they transition into adulthood, career, and advanced education.



**100%** of the 2025 graduating class enrolled in the Alumni Program

**79%** of enrolled Alumni engage with the program via resources, newsletters and events

**22%** of peer mentors are First Star Alumni

### FIRST STAR STUDENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE (SAC)

First Star encourages advocacy and engagement in social justice through the Scholar Advisory Committee (SAC). SAC is composed of current scholars from across the First Star Academy network and from the Alumni Program. SAC allows scholars to build community, freely share their ideas and opinions, and dialogue about important issues!







#### National Graduating Class









# FIRST STAR ASU IMPACT

## 2024-2025 ACADEMIC YEAR



### LIFE SKILLS AND SELF DISCOVERY

Through a series of skill-building workshops, youth strengthened their personal and interpersonal development. The Budgeting and Financial Literacy course, provided by the Arizona Council on Economic Education (ACEE), equipped participants with essential money management skills, helping them create personal budgets and make informed financial decisions. The Boundaries: Creating and Communicating workshop supported youth in establishing healthy limits and communicating them effectively to promote self-respect and well-being. Additionally, the Conflict Resolution workshop enhanced participants' ability to navigate disagreements constructively, fostering stronger relationships and collaboration among peers.

### HEALTH AND WELLBEING

The program's Health and Well-Being highlight emphasized the importance of both physical and mental wellness through engaging activities and interactive sessions. Scholars participated in fitness workshops such as yoga and skateboarding, practiced mindfulness, and took part in round-robin basketball and volleyball games, all designed to promote holistic health and balance.



### CAREER EXPLORATION

Program highlights included the Me3 Career Quiz and Presentation, a field trip to ASU's Marston Theatre for a 3D Space Show and tour of the space museum and labs, and a visit to Cerreta's Candy Factory, where scholars learned about business, marketing, and food safety before creating their own candy bars. Additionally, Dress for Success hosted a session to support graduating seniors with résumé development and provided each student with a professional outfit for interviews.

### LEADERSHIP AND SELF ADVOCACY

Scholars took part in the Resilience: How to Overcome workshop and a Foster Youth Rights and Self-Advocacy session led by DCS Peer Mentors, gaining valuable tools to navigate challenges and advocate for themselves. They also enjoyed a hands-on team-building experience through their very own escape room activity, designed to promote problem-solving and collaboration.



### COLLEGE READINESS

Scholars toured ASU's Downtown Campus and Maricopa County Community College's South Mountain Campus, exploring diverse pathways to higher education. They participated in the "Sweet 16: Credits for College/GPA Matters" workshop, led by a school counselor from Mesa Unified School District and former foster parent, and engaged in a Personal Statement Development course facilitated by the ASU Nina Scholars Leadership team. Additionally, scholars utilized the Exact Path Diagnostic to develop personalized tutoring plans in Math, Reading, and Language Arts, supporting their individual academic growth.

## BRIGHT FUTURES AHEAD

The National Bright Futures Survey was developed in partnership with Dr. Philip Hong from the University of Georgia to better understand our scholars' hopes and aspirations as it relates to their academic and future goals. In creating this survey and collecting feedback from scholars, we are embracing the challenge young people face and how we can be better stewards of their emotions and feelings as we support their growth in our Academies!

## COMMUNITY IMPACT



### PEER MENTOR RECOGNITION

First Star recognizes the positive impact peer mentors have on our scholars. The First Star ASU Academy awarded two peer mentors this summer for their years of service and unwavering support of the academy.

- 62% are current students or alumni of host university
- 53% identify as first generation
- 27% identify as current or former foster youth
- 11% identify as former First Star scholars



### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The ASU Academy partners with Bridging Success on campus for peer mentor support and professional development opportunities for alumni.



### CAREGIVER ENGAGEMENT

First Star ASU Academy hosted Caregiver Orientations and other engagement events on campus during the school year.

Caregivers at ASU Academy receive monthly check-ins on their scholar's participation in the program and are involved in their student's academic case management meetings.



### CREATION CONFERENCE

The Creation Conference was a one-day event for high school and young adult scholars with foster care experience, providing inspiration, resources, and connections. Hosted with all First Star Academies and live-streamed nationwide, the conference empowered youth to envision and pursue their futures while building community and access to opportunities.
